SGA Resolution 1-25-S A Resolution to Increase the Student Activity Fee Whereas: The last time a Student Activity Fee was implemented at MTSU was in 2014, and since then, student needs as well as program and operational costs have increased without a corresponding increase in the SAF. Whereas: The current Student Activity Fee rate hinders MTSU's ability to attract and increase student involvement through enhancing and increasing program and event opportunities, whether through offerings for student organizations, concerts, and other events, thereby contributing to the overall low student engagement rates. Whereas: MTSU must stay on par with other universities of similar student population and demographics, many of which have much higher activity fees that provide for various programming and operational costs. Whereas: This Student Activity Fee increase would help offset rising costs due to inflation, increased expenses, and the growing MTSU student population. THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE 87TH CONGRESS OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF MIDDLE TENNESSEE STATE UNIVERSITY THAT: Section 1: The Student Activity Fee paid by students taking seven or more credit hours will be increased by ten dollars each year for the next three years. Section 2: The Student Activity Fee shall be increased gradually over the course of three years to minimize impact on students and stay within university guidelines. The increase shall take place as follows: Department CurrentAllocation Year 1Increase Year 2Increase Year 3Increase TOTAL Student Government Association \$5.25 - \$1.00 \$1.00 \$7.25 Student Programming \$5.00 - \$1.00 \$2.00 \$8.00 Sports Clubs \$3.00 - - - \$3.00 Distinguished Lectures \$3.00 - - \$3.00 Signature Events \$6.00 \$7.00 \$7.00 \$3.00 \$23.00 Student Organizations \$13.00 - \$1.00 \$2.00 \$16.00 Student Union Services \$4.75 \$3.00 - \$2.00 \$9.75 Section 3: For all future Student Activity Fee increase proposals that total less than five dollars, a simple majority vote by the SGA Senate will allow the increase to go into effect. All proposals totaling above five dollars will have to go to referendum to be voted on by the student body. Section 4: Upon favorable passage by the Senate, this proposal will be presented to the student body for approval as a referendum.
